

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Format

All manuscripts should be submitted in their final form and should conform to the following guidelines:

- Typed, double spaced, pages numbered, with 1.5 inch (3.75 cm) margins.
- Title page must include the names, titles, degrees, affiliations, and correspondence information for all authors.
- Tables and figures should be printed on separate pages and should be numbered in the order in which they are referred to in the text, e.g. (table 1) (figure 1).
- An acronym used repeatedly should be cited in its entirety along with the abbreviation in parentheses on first reference: e.g.: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). All subsequent citations should use only the abbreviation.

References

- The journal follows the *Chicago Manual of Style* in using endnotes rather than footnotes. Endnotes should be listed at the end of each article in sequential order.
- Place endnote number at the end of the sentence in which it appears.
- Assign a separate number to each endnote throughout the text, even when referring back to a source previously cited.
- Use "Ibid." to save space when referring to a single work (the only work cited) in the immediately preceding endnote.

Submission

- Three paper copies of manuscript.
- One copy of manuscript on diskette (Mac or PC format) preferably in MS Word 5.0-6.0.
- For Articles include an abstract of no more than 150 words.
- All submitted manuscripts are subject to editorial review and revision; those that are accepted will be edited according to journal standards.

Copyright

- The journal will consider manuscripts submitted for publication with the understanding that they have not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere.
- Once a manuscript has been accepted for publication, it becomes property of the journal of *Health and Human Rights* and may not be reproduced or published elsewhere without written permission. In accordance with the 1978 U.S. copyright law, all authors submitting manuscripts to the journal must sign a copyright transfer agreement, which will be sent upon acceptance of the manuscript.

Approximate Word Limits

Article:

5,000 words

In-depth, referenced analysis using health and human rights framework.

Commentary:

2,500 words

Critical essay exploring or interpreting a specific issue in health and human rights.

Report:

2,500 words

An account illustrating health and human rights work of a particular organization or program.

Profile:

2,500 words

A description of programs, networks or organizations.

Book Review:

1,500 words

Peer review of current publications.

Bibliography:

1,500 words

Annotated selection of published work focused on a specific issue or area in health and human rights.

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
