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Health and Human Rights: An International Journal began publication in 1994 under the editorship of Jonathan Mann, who was succeeded in 1997 by Sofia Gruskin. Paul Farmer, co-founder of Partners In Health, assumed the editorship in 2007. A leading forum of debate on global health and rights concerns, Health and Human Rights moved to an open access online publication with Volume 10, Number 1, in 2008. The journal maintains a tradition of critical scholarship and also provides an inclusive forum for action-oriented dialogue among human rights practitioners, with two peerreviewed sections, "Critical Concepts" and "Health and Human Rights in Practice." "Critical Concepts" articles focus rigorous scholarly analysis on the conceptual foundations and challenges of rights discourse and action in relation to health. Articles in "Health and Human Rights in Practice" highlight innovative and direct engagement with human rights as they relate to health, and offer an opportunity to empower new voices from the field. Complementary and mutually reinforcing, these sections seek to foster engaged scholarship and invite informed action by and with communities to realize the full spectrum of human rights.
